


We bring people closer to nature!

How to get there

By bus from Cuxhaven station to the Seehospital stop By car to Cuxhaven-Sahlenburg; from there, the route is signposted

The entire building, including the exhibition area, is wheelchair accessible. Visitors with impaired mobility are invited to hire our wattmobile free of charge to tour the mudflats.

Our events

The Visitor Centre offers various attractions for everyone to experience the Wadden Sea. There are guided nature tours to the mudflats, the saltmarshes or the coastal heathland. Individual dates can be arranged for groups.



Excursions

Our coastal mudflats excursions introduce you to the Wadden Sea flora and fauna, and afterwards in the seminar room you can see a live projection of the small animals magnified by the video microscope.



Get to know our coastline

The heathland has been preserved on Cuxhaven's steep sand dunes ("geest") and the exceptional part is: there is no dyke here to separate land and sea. At the sand cliff, heathland or woods merge naturally into the Wadden Sea.

Our exhibition

Here at the Wadden Sea Visitor Centre, we would like to give all our guests a better understanding of the amazing natural world of the Wadden Sea. A special thematic focus is on the Wadden Sea as a World Natural Heritage site and the coastal heathlands of Cuxhaven. You can either tour the permanent exhibition independently using an audio guide, or delve into the books and media library: whatever you choose, just the exceptional view from the panorama windows makes the visit worthwhile.



UNESCO-World Natural Heritage

The significance of the Wadden Sea has been further emphasised by its designation as a UNESCO World Natural Heritage site.



Aquariums

The North Sea aquariums house the typical inhabitants of the Wadden Sea in their underwater habitat. You will have a good view of flatfishes, crabs, shrimps, prawns, etc.



Species table

This shows species from coast and heathland, and the exhibition even includes Europe's largest land mammal, the bison.





Ranger Jan

Our sea eagle Ranger Jan accompanies children by audioguide through the exhibition. The attentive ranger knows the tidal flats and coastal heathlands very well.
